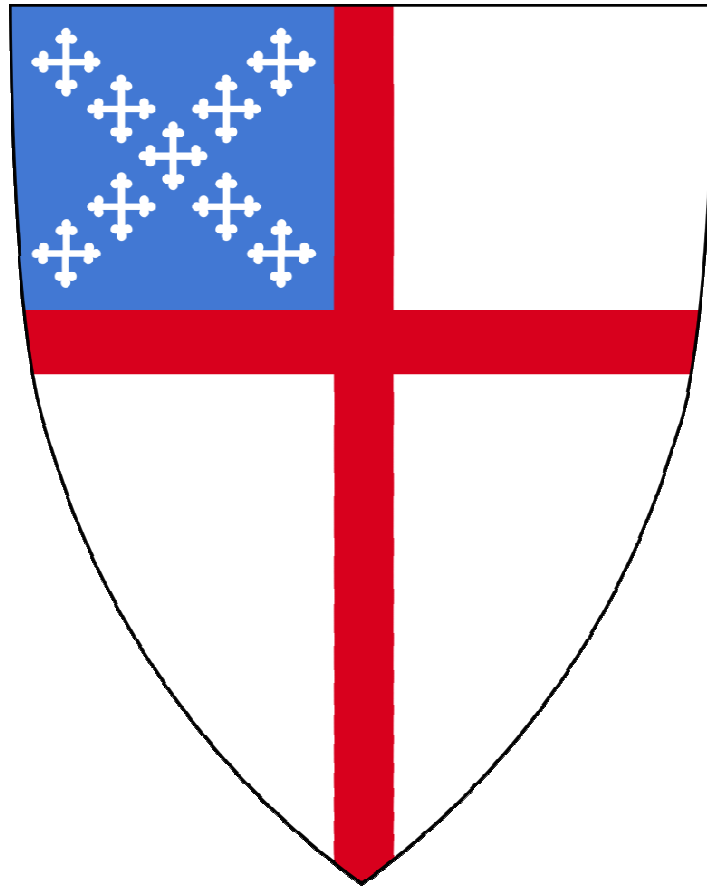

## ABOUT THE CATHEDRAL CHOIR

---

Established in 1883, the CATHEDRAL CHOIR is one of the oldest Episcopal choral establishments in the United States. The choir sings weekly choral services at THE CATHEDRAL CHURCH OF SAINT JOHN during the academic term and also offers concerts and additional performances throughout the year. The choir enjoys an international reputation as one of the finest examples of the Anglican choral tradition and has toured extensively throughout the United States and overseas. In 2003 the choir toured England where it sang services at Exeter Cathedral, Truro Cathedral, and Buckfast Abbey; in 2008 the choir toured New York City where it sang at St Thomas' Church Fifth Avenue, Trinity Church Wall Street, The Cathedral Church of Saint John the Divine, St Patrick's Cathedral, and St Bartholomew Church; and in 2011 the choir was in residence at the National Cathedral and St Paul's Church K-Street in Washington, DC. Other notable performances include singing at the opening of a Philadelphia Phillies game, the Commonwealth Awards at the Hotel de Pont, THE ASSOCIATION OF ANGLICAN MUSICIAN'S Region III Conference, the Arts Summit of the DELAWARE DIVISION OF THE ARTS, the Inaugural Reception for Governor Ruth Ann Minner, and the OPERADELAWARE production of Giacomo Puccini's Turandot.

The trebles of the choir (boys and girls aged 7-14 with unchanged voices) are drawn from the CATHEDRAL CHOIR SCHOOL OF DELAWARE, while the alto, tenor, and bass parts are sung by a dedicated group of semi-professional adults and Choir School choristers with changed voices. The Cathedral Choir School provides its students with a unique after-school experience that combines professional choral training, piano and voice lessons, leadership development, academic tutoring and one-on-one mentoring. The choristers are trained chorally according to the standards set forth by THE ROYAL SCHOOL OF CHURCH MUSIC and earn ribbons of various colors to represent their rank within the ensemble. The program uses music as a positive intervention in the lives of young people, many of whom live in the Brandywine Village neighborhood surrounding the cathedral.

The Cathedral Choir School is a winner of the prestigious COMING UP TALLER AWARD, our nation's highest honor for exemplary after-school programs for children and youth by the President's Committee on the Arts and Humanities. Choir School students performed for the awards ceremony and for First Lady Laura Bush at the White House.

The Cathedral Choir School is open to all children and youth ages 7-17 regardless of their religious affiliation or background and any child who loves to sing is encouraged to apply. The Director of Music, Eugene Lavery, is always happy to meet with prospective choristers and their families. Auditions are held throughout the year by appointment, and no prior musical training is necessary or expected.
